

Pastor's Corner

Do you feel it yet? Because it's just around the corner... The old ghost of holiday stress is about to rear its ugly head and take its toll on the holiday season. With it of course comes the unwanted guests of anxiety, frazzled nerves, and waves of frustration finding a way to emerge and steal your joy.

Sigh. Yep, seasonal stress is here!

Ok, my friends, take a deep breath – in and out. And rest in the Lord this season. Bring Him your praises along with your worry, fret, and stress. Trust me, He can handle it. Lay all those burdens at His feet and let this wonderful season filled with hope, promises and truth wash over you. Let our mighty God flood your striving and weary soul with His sense of peace.

Sit in the present moment. When you feel the weight of all things bearing down on your shoulders, and joy is robbed by forgetfulness or the "to do" list, pause and sit in the moment. When we place our focus on the past or feel overwhelmed by the future, we miss out on what is happening right in front of us. Take the time to sit and enjoy the moment you're currently in; there within lies a glimpse of the joy of this season.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." Proverbs 3:5-6 has been a go-to verse for me on many occasions. It reminds me that God is in control, and I am not. Placing our trust in God by letting go of our way and seeking His will allows us to soften our hearts, knowing that everything will work out for good, even if it may not make sense to us. If you are carrying around pain or hurt today, will you hand it over to God and invite Him into the wounds of your heart?

Gaze upon hope. Anxiety can so easily take hold and fester within us, multiplying in ways that require relief from its strangling hold. When we take our anxious hearts to God, He reminds us that while our circumstances can lead to trouble, He remains faithfully the same. Not only that, but He can cause us to find joy in times of great bouts of anxiety in the form of hope. Place the plans aside for a moment, gaze upon that nativity scene you walk past in your living room every day, and fill your heart with the hope found in that precious image.

Allow yourself time to rest: physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Tell yourself that it's okay to take a break and even a nap if needed. It's okay to say "no". It's okay to sit and watch Christmas movies all day, guilt-free. It's okay to sit alone in your car, away from the noise, and just lean into His precious presence.

Seek stillness and gain peace. We are all searching for peace, but the peace Jesus offers us is unlike that of this world. His peace envelopes our hearts and gives us the reassurance that while chaos and disorder take place here on this earth, He is the gateway to calm our inner worry while offering peace outside of this broken world. Lean into that promise today when discord strikes, leaving you feeling uneasy. Peace requires us to be still. Find stillness today, and let the Prince of Peace remind your troubled heart that He is drawing near, and

you will one day be living in His everlasting peace.

Cherish those you love. In Luke's gospel Jesus points out that worrying about life will do nothing. He is not saying that we are to live irresponsibly, expecting others (or maybe even God) to come through and take care of us. But rather, we are told in this verse to live in a manner that sees life as built on precious moments that we must cherish, recognizing that this life is indeed short. This year, as you sit around the table, thank God for each person there and the blessings they bring to your family. Tuck within your heart that those dynamics may change next year. Let the "mini" moments that often go unnoticed fill your heart with love. Notice the smiles, hear the laughter, take in the smells and sights of this season and let it bring about a sense of calming peace.

May this holiday season be filled with less stress and more precious memories you can hold near and dear to your heart.






As many of you know the RCA is changing... After years of disagreement on human sexuality, interpretation of Scripture, polity, and other tensions, the denomination, the RCA provided those who no longer want to live in the tension an avenue to leave, with the blessing of the remaining churches. But this, along with the general decline in size of the North American church, has meant our denomination has severely shrunk.

Because of this shrinkage, in 2021 the General Synod approved a restructuring team tasked with proposing changes to the denomination's organizational structure for sustained spiritual growth and organizational health. The RCA's 2024 General Synod voted to condense regional synods and classes into a single judicial body: the Middle Assembly.

This change came at the recommendation of the restructuring team, which was tasked to discern and suggest an optimized denominational structure for a healthy, sustained future.
Changes to the Book of Church Order were developed and proposed

by the Commission on Church Order. Now that the constitutional changes have received initial approval, the RCA's classes will vote on them. If two-thirds of classes approve, the changes then need to be ratified by General Synod 2025.

Hello Church family! Our Sunday School children have been diving into some wonderful stories from the Old Testament. Over the past few weeks, they've been learning about some of the Bible's greatest heroes: Joshua, Noah, Esther, Daniel, David, Deborah, Gideon, Samson, Jonah, Moses, and Miriam. These incredible figures each show us that God can use anyone, no matter their age, size, or situation, to make a difference!

Our young learners have really taken these lessons to heart. Here are a few insights they've shared: "You can do pretty much everything with God's help," "Size doesn't matter, your heart does," and "Girls and boys can be heroes of God!" 


